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

127 farmers redeemed the 2017 ICGA Cover Crop Coupon for reduced cost oat and radish seed

To help Illinois farmers meet the requirements of the Illinois Nutrient Reduction Strategy, ICGA has grown very involved in conservation and nutrient loss work over the last several years. One important component of this work is helping Illinois farmers try cover crops on their farms with less cost and less risk. One way we're helping is to offer members a cover crop coupon, allowing them to buy cover crop seed at a reduced cost from several venders. ICGA also manages a cover crop program for farmers trying cover crops for the very first time, offering the seed, flown on to forty acres of their choice, for around \$15 per acre.

We understand that to change how you manage your farm, you first need to understand how the changes might impact your bottom line. In a time when the farm economy is so challenging, any negative consequence to your bottom line can spell disaster! We hope that these cover crop programs help mitigate the risk for you, and help you determine how you can integrate cover crops on your farm.

ICGA is also very involved in the Precision Conservation Management program. This program seeks to work directly with interested farmers to coach them through conservation changes to their acres and analyzes the financial impact to those practices. Through this program, farmers can quickly understand the positive and negative impacts that investments like planting cover crops can have for the future of their farms.



The ICGA Board of Directors travels to Washington, DC once a year as a group to discuss priority issues with our elected officials in their Washington, DC offices. This year, we focused considerably on trade.

Our message throughout the year has been simple: Farmers need trade, even more so in a severe economic downturn. We have heard from our members that they are supportive of the President's efforts to negotiate fair and equitable trade deals, but we also know that the process of the negotiation is having major negative consequences on Illinois farms.



There are things Congress can do to

help mitigate the pain unfinished trade agreements. Funding for programs like the Foreign Market Development Program and the Market Access Program in the Farm Bill are crucial and we've discussed those at length. Fast congressional approval for a potential trade agreement, once it's been negotiated, would also help farmers to be able to capitalize on the new terms quickly. And, of course, ICGA continues to be engaged in the Market Facilitation Program. Though our farmers prefer trade, not aid, we know the MFP funds came at an important time for our Illinois farm families.

ICGA started preparing for a new farm bill in late 2016 with a round of farm bill listening sessions. The most important thing we heard from you in those sessions was that preserving crop insurance was key to your farm family's survival.

When the House and the Senate passed versions of a farm bill in June 2018, we were elated. It took work, including a last-minute lobbying effort to prevent crop insurance amendment #3103 from being included in the Senate version, but with your help we passed two farm bills that both preserved the integrity of the federal crop insurance program.

Now we wait. ICGA shared priorities for the conference committee version of the Farm Bill, and we were able to get three of our four ideas included. We'll call that a win whether the final farm bill passes this year or not!





President Trump promises "very close" on E15

Moving a majority of the fuel sold to E15 represents a huge market opportunity for Illinois corn and some demand to buoy corn prices during a very difficult time for farmers. In July, President Trump told us he was "very close" to the Reid Vapor Pressure Waiver that would allow E15 to be sold year-round. He finalized the waiver on October 9.

Ethanol has represented the fastest growing marketing opportunity for your corn for several years, and in a severe economic downturn like you are currently experiencing ICGA is looking for fast growth opportunities for corn demand. We are working on growing international markets for American ethanol and have seen growth in ethanol exports of 18.5% as of July 2018 from the prior year.

Work in this area with international environmental policies continues. The price of corn-based ethanol makes exports an easy sell to other global markets.


House of Representatives passed the America's Water Infrastructure Act of 2018 and passed a three-bill package including funding for the Army Corps of Engineers to help lock upgrades.
